GROUND RULES FOR DANCES

- The DJ shall be directly under the supervision of the BYUHSA Officers present.
- All Students are to present their Student ID Cards. If the dance is open to non-students, then ID cards are required.
- There shall be no opening of entrances or exits to allow unauthorized persons in.
- Dances shall be safe.
- All in attendance shall be in compliance with the Dress and Grooming Standards and the Honor Code of BYU-Hawai'i.
- Friday Night Dances shall end at Midnight.
- Dances shall have ample lighting.
- Dances shall be a good socializing time.
- Dances shall be safe and without mosh pits, etc. Shall the DJ observe this activity, the DJ is instructed to cease playing of the current song and switch to another song, instructing all in attendance over microphone, to not injure or harm others.

GROUND RULES FOR MUSIC BEING PLAYED AT A BYUHSA DANCE

- No song shall have sexual connotations or other themes of unrighteousness.
- Music must not too loud – 2 measures of effective volume are:
 1. Dance attendees must be able to hear one another with a large measure of clarity.
 2. One's chest need not feel the bass heavily.
- One genre of music must not be played more than another. Playing of all genres is not intended in this rule, but the music must be evenly distributed and not only from one genre. Music from other eras is welcomed as long as the other rules are not violated.
- There should be at least one slow song every half an hour.
- The DJ shall not accept any requests for songs if requests violate theses ground rules.
